

Russia Banned from the Paralympic Games

Russia will NOT be competing in the 2016 Paralympic Games in Rio. After losing their court case which originally banned them for using performance enhancing drugs (PEDs) on August 7th, 2016, their appeal request was denied August 23rd and means they are officially banned from the 2016 Paralympic Games in Rio.

Isis Attacks a Military Training Camp In Aden

Yemen: ISIS has claimed responsibility for a suicide car bombing Monday that killed dozens of recruits at a military training camp in Yemen's southern port city of Aden, according to the ISIS-affiliated Amaq news agency. At least 71 people were killed in the attack, and at least 33 others were wounded. A car bomb exploded inside the camp claiming multiple militant's lives and is claimed to be the latest bloody attack in the country's civil war. The explosion happened at 8:15 local time on Monday, August 29, 2016.




Music
